#### Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Kirk Saarloos** to the mound tonight, facing off against Charlotte's RHP **Jack Egbert**. The Clippers are 18-20 against right-handers this season. Egbert has faced the Clippers once in his career, picking up the win on 5/25 in Columbus (5.0IP, 2H, 1R, 0ER, 0BB, 1K). The Clippers are on game #3 of an eight game road trip through Charlotte (1-1) and Gwinnett.

#### vs. the Knights

Columbus has won four of the last five against the Knights as each of the last five games have been decided by 2 runs. Despite having a winning record against Charlotte, the Clippers are hitting .239 (47x197) and have a 4.92ERA against the Knights. Both of those numbers are the second worst against any opponent this season (.205 average against Pawtucket and 6.30ERA against Norfolk). Individually, **Michael Brantley** is hitting .304 (7x23) with a HR and 4RBI in six games against the Knights.

#### Inching Towards the Race

**Andy Marte** is hitting .328 (43x131) after last night's 2x4 game. That would rank 5th in the I.L., but Marte is still four plate appearances short of qualifying for the batting title. At four plate appearances per game, it will take Marte three games to qualify and at five plate appearances per game, it will take him only two games to qualify. Currently, Columbus has two players in the top 10 with **Jordan Brown** placing 5th at .327 (55x168) and **Michael Aubrey** 7th at .322 (47x146). The last Clipper to lead the I.L. in hitting was **Fernando Seguin** during his IL MVP season of 2003 (franchise-best .341).

#### Struggling Offense

Despite being out-hit in nine of the last 11 games (94 hits to 131), the Clippers have managed to go 5-6. They have been outscored 63-53 over that same 11-game span.

#### Good First Impression

**Chris Gimenez** became the fifth Clipper to make his Major League debut this season, when he came in as a defensive replacement at first base Wednesday night in Minnesota. He joined **Trevor Crowe** (4/9 at Texas), **Tony Sipp** (4/22 vs. Kansas City), **Matt LaPorta** (5/3 at Detroit) and **David Huff** (5/17 at Tampa Bay). Crowe was the only one of the five to make his debut prior to suiting up with Columbus. Yesterday, he got his first start (at Minnesota) and collected his first Major League hit, a solo HR off of **Scott Baker** in the 7th inning. He joins **Matt LaPorta** and **Michael Aubrey** as recent Indians to jack a home run for their first Major League hit. LaPorta accomplished the feat on 5/4 at Toronto and Aubrey turned the trick last season on 5/18 at Cincinnati.

#### Clippers Sailing to Cleveland

Monday's roster move (**Tony Sipp** to Cleveland) has now put eight Opening Day Clippers on the active Cleveland roster with an additional one on the Indian DL (**Aaron Laffey**). Of Cleveland's active 25, 13 have played with Columbus at some point this season.

# Columbus Clippers Game Information

Friday, June 5

## So Much For Roster Stability

The Clippers sent **Travis Hafner** to Cleveland today. Through the first month of the season, the Clippers had made only 19 roster moves. They made 62 in May and three so far in June, running the total to 84 and putting them on pace for 224 (franchise record is 188 moves, set in 2008).

## Who's on First?

In each of the last two seasons, **Larry Broadway** was the mainstay of the Columbus lineup while leading the Clippers in most starts at one position, tallying 110 starts at first base last year and 100 at first in 2007 (only player in each season to start at least 100 games at the same spot). So far in 2009, first base has been the most unstable position, as **Michael Aubrey** has played 31 at first, **Jordan Brown** has been there 14 times, **Andy Marte**, **Matt LaPorta** and **Chris Gimenez** have each logged three games at first and **Stephen Head** has been there once.

## Quality Control

**Tomo Ohka** notched the first quality start of the season for the Clippers on 4/16 at Toledo, snapping the team's seven game streak without a quality start to open the season. Ohka is tied for the team lead with **Jack Cassel** and **Kirk Saarloos** with six quality starts. On the season, the Clippers have tallied a quality start in 50.0% of games this season (27 of 54). Last year, the Clipper staff made 63 quality starts in 142 games (44.3%) with **Mike O'Connor** leading the way at 13.

## Sloppiness in the Field

After playing flawlessly on Opening Day, the Clippers went on to make an error in 10 consecutive games (15 total errors) to drop to dead last in the league in fielding percentage. From 4/28-5/19, they committed just three errors in 18 games, including a 59-inning errorless streak over nine games between 5/3 at Durham and 5/11 vs. Pawtucket. That put them into a tie for 1st with a .980 fielding percentage. They have since dropped to 11th (.976) and have made multiple errors in five of the last seven games (12 errors total). Last season the Clippers set team records in both fielding percentage (.982) and fewest errors (92), beating out the 1997 squad (.980, 102 errors). This season, Columbus is 11-17 when they make an error and 5-7 when making multiple errors.

## Free Baseball

On 5/17 at Scranton/WB, Columbus played their first extra-inning game of the '09 season, becoming the 2nd to last team in the I.L. to play more than the number of innings scheduled. Columbus has since played two overtime contests and are now 7-15 in their last 22 extra inning games dating back to the start of the 2007 season, with all seven wins coming on the road (three wins at Louisville). The last time the Clippers won an extra inning game in Columbus was on 9/1/06 vs. Toledo (4-2, 12 inn.), having lost seven straight games at home since then. They have played a total of 40 extra frames and scored a total of 13 runs in the last 22 games. Overall, they have been outscored 25-13 in extra innings over their last 22.

## Out of the Slump

With wins in both games of 5/14's double header against Lehigh Valley, the Clippers recorded their first two 7-inning wins of the season and their first double header sweep since 5/8/08 (Rochester). They had been swept in all three double headers previously this season. They are currently 3-7 in double header games this season, leading the I.L. in double headers played (5) and 7-inning losses (7).

## Men of Steal

After finishing last season with 144SB, the Clippers improved upon their stolen base total for the fifth consecutive season since the 2003 squad mustered only 48SB (2nd lowest total in franchise history). This year the team is off the one steal a game pace, but **Michael Brantley** has gotten off to a speedy start, with 16SB through the first 54 games, including 2SB games at Toledo (4/17) and at Durham (5/2). He is 3rd in the I.L. and is on pace to swipe 43 bags, which would be the most since **Kerry Robinson** had 75 in 2000.

## I.L. Honors

The International League announced on 5/25 that **Jordan Brown** was selected as Player of the Week for 5/18-5/24. He hit .519 (14x27) with 3HR and 7RBI during the week, including his first career 2HR game (5/24 at Buffalo). **Matt LaPorta** was the first Clipper this season to be named Player of the Week (4/20-4/26). For his week, the Clipper outfielder hit .520 (13x25), leading the International League with 13 hits, 10 runs scored, and a .613 on-base percentage, including four multi-hit games. Last season **Kory Casto** (5/19-5/26) and **Jason Bergmann** (4/28-5/5) were selected as Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively.

## Lovullo Reaches Milestone

**Torey Lovullo** managed his 1,000th regular season game on 4/24 vs. Indianapolis (W, 9-7). He currently owns a .544 winning percentage in regular season contests (565-473). In the International League, he is 241-239 (.502) and scheduled to manage his 500th game on 6/24 at Rochester. In the post-season, he has gone 15-12 (.556) with Kinston (2003-2004) and Akron (2005).

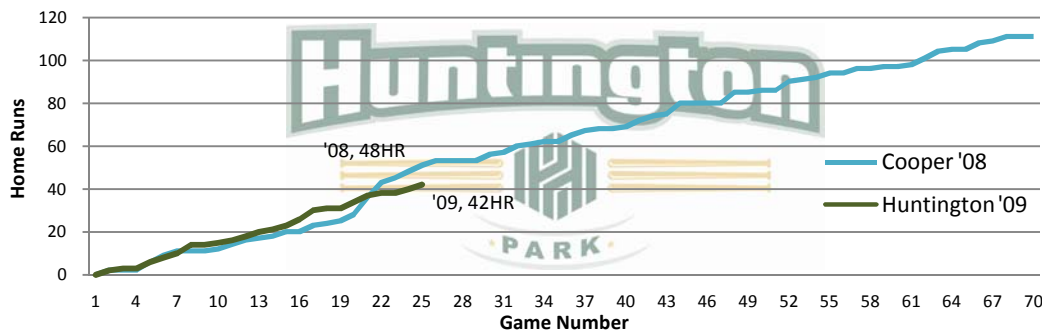

**Giving the Bullpen a Break:**

This season, Saarloos has averaged the most IP per start on the Columbus staff (6.4) and also averages the most pitches thrown per outing (97.9). His complete game on 5/19 at Scranton/WB was his second of the season (first was on 5/3 at Durham, 8.0IP), making him the first Clipper with two complete games in a season since **Kris Wilson** in 2006. In fact, Saarloos has more complete games this season than the entire group of pitchers that played for Columbus during the Washington Nationals affiliation from 2007-08 (**Mike O'Connor** had the lone complete game on 8/6/08 with a complete game shutout vs. Norfolk, breaking a 264 complete game-less streak for Columbus between 5/29/06 and 8/6/08).

**Deciding Factor:**

Saarloos leads the team in decisions, tallying a win or loss in nine of 10 starts. Until receiving a no-decision in his start on 5/14 vs. Lehigh Valley, he had been the only Clipper with more than one start to get the decision in every game pitched.

**Clamping Down with Two Down:**

So far this year, Saarloos has not allowed a single runner to cross the plate with two outs in the inning. He has been nearly perfect with runners in scoring position and two out, retiring 23 of 28 batters faced (four walks and a single). In an additional 18 situations with a runner on first and two outs, he has held the opponents scoreless while allowing four hits with two walks.

**2009 Spring Training:**

In spring training with Cleveland, Saarloos pitched in seven games, going 0-1 with a 9.58ERA (10.1IP, 13H, 14R, 11ER, 8BB, 8K). He was reassigned to minor league camp on 3/24.

**2008 Season (full bio on page 91):**

Started the season with Sacramento in the Oakland organization... made two starts with the River Cats, going 2-0 with a 2.45ERA (11.0IP, 13H, 3R, 3ER, 1BB, 7K) prior to having contract purchased by Oakland on 4/14... made two relief appearances for the A's (7.2IP, 4H, 3R, 2ER, 2BB, 1K)... outrighted to Sacramento on 4/25... took the loss in a complete game at Round Rock on 7/29... had contract purchased by Oakland on 8/18... picked up a win that night at Minnesota (3.2IP, 3H, 0R, 0ER, 0BB, 3K)... made only start of the season for Oakland in last appearance on 9/20 vs. Seattle (3.1IP, 7H, 5R, 5ER, 1BB, 0K)... with Oakland all relief appearances were over 1.0IP, including two appearances of at least 5.0IP (4/17 vs. Seattle, 8/29 vs. Minnesota)... made 13 quality starts with Sacramento... ranked 8th in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (4.22).
