Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Zach Jackson** to the mound tonight, facing off against Gwinnett's LHP **Francisley Bueno**. The Clippers are 9-7 against left-handers this season. Bueno has pitched against the Clippers once in his career, not figuring in the decision of the R-Braves 8-4 win over Columbus on 8/22/08 (4.1IP, 6H, 4R, 4ER, 1BB, 5K).

vs. the Braves

The Clippers trounced Gwinnett 12-0 Saturday night to begin their International League rivalry. The Clippers are now 7-10 in their first contests against International League opponents. For the last 32 years, the Clippers went 290-232 against the Braves' Triple-A affiliate in Richmond, going 140-120 on the road against the top Atlanta farm team.

Inching Towards the Race

Andy Marte qualified for the batting title with four plate appearances last night (1x4). After playing in only six games during April, he has taken over as the everyday third baseman for Columbus since **Wes Hodges** injured his shoulder on 4/28. He has hit .331 (40x121) since then to move into 7th in the I.L. in hitting, between teammates **Michael Aubrey** (6th at .325; 50x154) and **Jordan Brown** (8th at .318; 56x176). The last Clipper to lead the I.L. in hitting was **Fernando Seguinol** during his IL MVP season of 2003 (franchise-best .341).

Using the Big Inning

In six games during June, the Clippers have had nine multiple run innings, scoring 87% of their runs for the month in those innings (34 of 39). On the season, Columbus has been held scoreless in 333 of 480 offensive innings (69%), scored one run in 77 innings (16%) and scored more than once 70 times (15%). The Clippers are 27-11 (.711) when having a multi-run inning and 2-17 (.105) when they don't.

Joining the Club

Saturday night the Clippers became the last team in the I.L. to record a shutout when the trio of **Chuck Lofgren**, **Blaine Neal** and **Masa Kobayashi** held the Braves scoreless for the game. It was the first shutout for Columbus since 8/29/08 when four Clippers combined to blank the Toledo Mud Hens at Fifth Third Field. Last season, the Clippers finished last in the league with only four shutouts, following a 2007 season in which Columbus led the league with 15 shutouts (2nd highest total in team history).

Brantley Finding His Stroke

Over the last 17 games, **Michael Brantley** has hit .324 (22x68) to raise his batting average 30 points to .263. He has seven multi-hit efforts in over that span and also has hit 2HR, giving him 3HR on the season (one shy of his career high, set last year).

Clippers Sailing to Cleveland

Monday's roster move (**Tony Sipp** to Cleveland) has now put eight Opening Day Clippers on the active Cleveland roster with an additional one on the Indian DL (**Aaron Laffey**). Of Cleveland's active 25, 13 have played with Columbus at some point this season.

So Much For Roster Stability

The Clippers added free agents **Rob Mackowiak** and **Mike Gosling** Saturday, to get back to a full roster. Through the first month of the season, the Clippers had made only 19 roster moves. They made 62 in May and five so far in June, running the total to 86 and putting them on pace for 220 (franchise record is 188 moves, set in 2008).

This Date in Clipper History

6/8/1988

Scott Nielsen pitched the first 9-inning no-hitter in Clipper history when he silenced the bats of the Maine Phillies in a 3-0 win at Cooper Stadium. It was the 2nd of five no-hitters to the Clippers credit, following Rod Scurry's 7-inning no-no 11 years prior during the Clippers inaugural season (7/25 vs. Richmond). Nielsen would be named Clipper of the Year after going 13-6 with a 2.40ERA in 1988.

Who's on First?

In each of the last two seasons, **Larry Broadway** was the mainstay of the Columbus lineup while leading the Clippers in most starts at one position, tallying 110 starts at first base last year and 100 at first in 2007 (only player in each season to start at least 100 games at the same spot). So far in 2009, first base has been the most unstable position, as **Michael Aubrey** has played 31 at first, **Jordan Brown** has been there 14 times, **Matt LaPorta** six, **Andy Marte** and **Chris Gimenez** have each logged three games at first and **Stephen Head** has been there once.

Quality Control

Tomo Ohka notched the first quality start of the season for the Clippers on 4/16 at Toledo, snapping the team's seven game streak without a quality start to open the season. **Jack Cassel** leads the team with seven quality starts (five in a row). On the season, the Clippers have tallied a quality start in 50.8% of games this season (29 of 57). Last year, the Clipper staff made 63 quality starts in 142 games (44.3%) with **Mike O'Connor** leading the way at 13.

Sloppiness in the Field

After playing flawlessly on Opening Day, the Clippers went on to make an error in 10 consecutive games (15 total errors) to drop to dead last in the league in fielding percentage. From 4/28-5/19, they committed just three errors in 18 games, including a 59-inning errorless streak over nine games between 5/3 at Durham and 5/11 vs. Pawtucket. That put them into a tie for 1st with a .980 fielding percentage. They have since dropped to 11th (.977) and have made multiple errors in five of the last 10 games (14 errors total). Last season the Clippers set team records in both fielding percentage (.982) and fewest errors (92), beating out the 1997 squad (.980, 102 errors). This season, Columbus is 12-18 when they make an error and 5-7 when making multiple errors.

Free Baseball

On 5/17 at Scranton/WB, Columbus played their first extra-inning game of the '09 season, becoming the 2nd to last team in the I.L. to play more than the number of innings scheduled. Columbus has since played two overtime contests and are now 7-15 in their last 22 extra inning games dating back to the start of the 2007 season, with all seven wins coming on the road (three wins at Louisville). The last time the Clippers won an extra inning game in Columbus was on 9/1/06 vs. Toledo (4-2, 12 inn.), having lost seven straight games at home since then. They have played a total of 40 extra frames and scored a total of 13 runs in the last 22 games. Overall, they have been outscored 25-13 in extra innings over their last 22.

Out of the Slump

With wins in both games of 5/14's double header against Lehigh Valley, the Clippers recorded their first two 7-inning wins of the season and their first double header sweep since 5/8/08 (Rochester). They had been swept in all three double headers previously this season. They are currently 3-8 in double header games this season, leading the I.L. in double headers played (5) and 7-inning losses (8).

Men of Steal

After finishing last season with 144SB, the Clippers improved upon their stolen base total for the fifth consecutive season since the 2003 squad mustered only 48SB (2nd lowest total in franchise history). This year the team is off the one steal a game pace, but **Michael Brantley** has gotten off to a speedy start, with 17SB through the first 57 games, including 2SB games at Toledo (4/17) and at Durham (5/2). He is 2nd in the I.L. and is on pace to swipe 43 bags, which would be the most since **Kerry Robinson** had 75 in 2000.

I.L. Honors

The International League announced on 5/25 that **Jordan Brown** was selected as Player of the Week for 5/18-5/24. He hit .519 (14x27) with 3HR and 7RBI during the week, including his first career 2HR game (5/24 at Buffalo). **Matt LaPorta** was the first Clipper this season to be named Player of the Week (4/20-4/26). For his week, the Clipper outfielder hit .520 (13x25), leading the International League with 13 hits, 10 runs scored, and a .613 on-base percentage, including four multi-hit games. Last season **Kory Casto** (5/19-5/26) and **Jason Bergmann** (4/28-5/5) were selected as Player and Pitcher of the Week, respectively.

Lovullo Reaches Milestone

Torey Lovullo managed his 1,000th regular season game on 4/24 vs. Indianapolis (W, 9-7). He currently owns a .545 winning percentage in regular season contests (567-474). In the International League, he is 243-240 (.503) and scheduled to manage his 500th game on 6/24 at Rochester. In the post-season, he has gone 15-12 (.556) with Kingston (2003-2004) and Akron (2005).

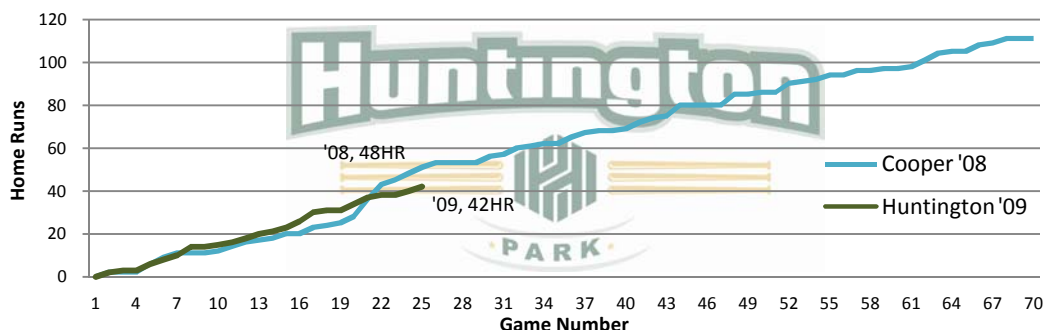

With the Big Boys:

Jackson made the Indians out of spring training as the long reliever out of the bullpen. He made two appearances for Cleveland in the first two weeks of the season, going 0-0 with an 5.79ERA (4.2IP, 6H, 3R, 3ER, 0BB, 6K). That included a 4.0IP game on 4/9 at Texas (4H, 2R, 2ER, 0BB, 6K). Overall, he inherited two runners and allowed both to score. He was optioned to Columbus on 4/23 and recalled on 5/27 to make a spot start at Tampa Bay (ND, 4.0IP, 8H, 7R, 6ER, 4BB, 4K).

Out of the 'pen:

Upon his arrival from Cleveland on 4/23, Jackson made his first three appearances for Columbus out of the bullpen. He has an 0-1 record with a 10.39ERA in relief for the Clippers (4.1IP, 6H, 8R, 5ER, 3BB, 1K). In his Clippers debut, on 4/23 vs. Indianapolis, he blew his only save opportunity of the season allowing an earned run in 2.0IP (first blown save for Columbus this season).

He Didn't Earn It:

After allowing a solo HR to Pawtucket's **Jonathan Van Every** in the 1st inning on 5/10, Jackson threw 20.0 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run (6/2 at Charlotte). He had tossed 9.0 scoreless innings following that HR, until a fielding error by **Andy Marte** in the 1st inning at Buffalo on 5/21 prolonged the inning, leading to three unearned runs allowed by Jackson. He responded with 5.0 scoreless innings to close out that start and 2.0 scoreless to begin the game on 6/2 at Charlotte until allowing two more unearned runs on two Clipper errors in the 3rd inning of that game.

2009 Spring Training:

In spring training with Cleveland, Jackson pitched in seven games, going 1-2 with a 6.52ERA (19.1IP, 22H, 15R, 14ER, 4BB, 11K). He made the Major League roster out of spring training for the first time in his career.
